The constitution states that eligible trustees are elected by the members at the annual general meeting held in each year. The appointment of the above trustees was confirmed at the AGM held on 19th March 2016.

Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The advancement of education, the advancement of religion, the relief of poverty and the assistance in the provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupation in the interests of social welfare with the object of improving the conditions of life for the people of Romania, in particular but not exclusively, children and the elderly, by providing financial and other assistance.

Activities in relation to advancement of education:

Supporting homework club in Teius, including wages for staff. School materials via Christmas boxes. Music tuition. Supporting the school in Berindei with equipment such as computers, whiteboards, tables, consumables and sports equipment.

Activities in relation to advancement of religion:

Supporting various activities in Teius, Cornesti, Timisoara and Berindei – encourage children and adults to attend their local church, singing of Christian music, evangelistic meetings and bible study.

Activities in relation to relief of poverty:

Provision of food to children from homework club in Teius. Second hand and new clothing. Humanitarian relief in Berindei. Clothing for the prisoners in Aiud gaol. Sponsorship of a nurse for home visits to the elderly in Berindei.

Activities in relation to facilities for recreation:

Support weekly clubs for sport, music and painting in Teius. Annual program of holiday camps and clubs for children from Teius, Cornesti, Berindei and Timisoara – by sponsorship of children and/or leadership teams. Provision of sports equipment. Construction of Youth Hall in Teius for sport, music and drama.

Additional details of objectives and activities (Optional information)

The current policy on grant making is that all grants are made direct to Romania. Grants are not made to individuals or organisations in UK. The majority of funds are focussed on Fundatia Emanuel Betania, a not-for-profit company registered in Teius, Romania.

There is no policy to invest funds. Funds not required for immediate use are held in an HSBC savings account.

During 2016 all transfers to Romania were carried out by SEPA in euros, which minimises the transaction charge.

The trustees are personally responsible for their own travel and administration costs. All volunteers are required to be self-funding. The charity's administration and transport costs are met by the trustees and do not appear in the payments section of the CC16a Accounts.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During 2016 the bulk of our financial support continued to go to Fundatia Emanuel Betania in Teius. Material aid was focussed on projects in other places, particularly Berindei in the south of Romania.

During 2016 we paved the yard between the house and hall in Teius, and purchased basketball and volley ball equipment.

The work with children from poor families in Teius has been undermined by the Rotary Club initiating a similar program in the Cultural Hall. We will be working to identify alternative activities during 2017.

Summer holiday camps were sponsored for 30 children from Cornesti. Craft materials and 120 T-shirts were donated to a camp from Timisoara.

Approximately 100 Christmas presents for poor children in Teius, and 80 presents in the village of Cornesti.

Private sponsors were found to help a number of university students.

We sent some men's clothing and sports items for prisoners in Aiud gaol.

We received quantities of medical dressings which were sent to Dr Alina Nistor in Berindei. We continued to sponsor a nurse in Berindei (year 3 of a 3 year project) to provide home visits for the elderly.

Trustee News: Martin Woodhall visited Romania twice during the year to check on the progress of projects.
